t is a proud moment for Amity as Tanya Kaur Talwar of Class XII got selected for the prestigious Lester B. Pearson International Scholar Award for the Class of 2025 by University of Toronto.

University of Toronto is Canada's largest university, and Lester B. Pearson Scholarship awarded by it is the most prestigious and competitive scholarship for international students. The scholarship covers tuition, books, incidental fees, and full residence support for four years. Each year, approximately 37 students world over are awarded Lester B. Pearson Scholarship. This year, Tanya did the school and the nation proud by being the only Indian to receive this scholarship.

As a student, Tanya has conducted cognitive psychology research at the age of 14 through the visionary platform of Vasudha, Amity's Inter School Science competition, envisioned by Dr (Mrs) Amita Chauhan, Chairperson, Amity Group of Schools and RBEF, to nurture the scientific spirit and temperament of young minds. She has designed a 'magic maze' that aims to create a diagnostic tool to identify intelligence based on visual-spatial and analytical abilities in scholastically-classified slow learners. The objective is to prove that there are no slow


