# LIFE GOES ON

Album: BE Artist: BTS Released on: November 20, 2020 Genre: Pop, hip hop

Synopsis: The album stands as a response to the COVID-19 pandemic and all the feelings that encompassed humanity because of it. The songs talks of life in the pandemic and provide a message of hope. Primarily a pop record mixed with BTS's trademark hiphop roots, the album is also the first one in the band's discography that is heavily created by the members alone, especially in terms of songwriting, production, development, and visual design. The songs in the album revolve around comfort, loneliness, anxiety, depression, frustration, restlessness, sadness, hope, connection, and finally joy.

Why is it worth listening: The album provides music that is a treat to one's ears with thoughtful lyrics that gives us messages of hope, guaranteeing that during hard times, we will end up playing the album on loop for comfort. Even though majority of the lyrics are in Korean (except Dynamite), the beauty of their music transcends linguistic boundaries. Not to mention how the translations are easily available on the internet to make the listeners connect to the true meaning of the songs. It is a mini album that imparts a message of healing by declaring that "even in the face of adversity, life goes on so let's live on"; it reflects the thoughts, emotions, and deepest ruminations of the members of

BTS. The title – BE – itself represents 'being' and captured the honest thoughts everyone felt during the pandemic. The songs are set in a cinematic arrangement of minor chords that includes acoustic guitar, twinkling pianos, and wistful strings. The emotional tracks make use of breathy vocals to confess fear, depression, burn-out, and pandemic-induced loneliness.

**Favorite song:** Life Goes On is my favourite track as it is the most relatable one. The song has slowyet-heavy sounding beats where the lyrics speak of the difficulties we faced during the pandemic. **Rating:** 5/5
