




MUN Walk



It aims at forming a forum wherein students (the age group of 10-18 years) can conduct individual research at the international level in natural sciences. The research aims at finding innovative solutions to problems of common concern, while strengthening cultural and global bonds.

mity Group of Schools hosted the 5th session of Young Researchers of Natural Sci-Lences (YRoNS) 2012, an international symposium on natural sciences. YRoNS is a platform that facilitates venture in natural science by young blood, between April 10-13, 2012.

The conference since its inception in the year 2008 has seen keen participation from countries in Europe. It was in the year 2010 that for the first time Amity International School (the only school from Asia) participated in YRoNS conference at Cyprus, followed by another in France in 2011.

Amity Educational Resource Centre and Amity Children Science Foundation organised first ever YRoNS conference hosted in India by AIS Noida under the leadership of Dr (Mrs) Amita Chauhan, Chairperson, Amity Group of Schools.

The event began with the traditional lighting of the lamp ceremony by Mr Dolaine, one of the core team members of the YRoNS.

What is the broad objective of YRoNS?

The main objective of YRoNS is to encourage young learners to research for themselves, to get them out of the classrooms and acquire real knowledge in-

stead of the one that comes from books. I will consider this objective as achieved when students come up and ask scientific questions and perform experiments to prove their own hypothesis. Another objective is to gather people with different ambitions and

bring them together to contribute to our common aim of a better tomorrow.

How is the theme for 2012 "Natural Resources- Care It, Share It" relevant to the present world scenario?

This is a question that is both difficult and easy. It's easy because it is all that the world can currently talk about; difficult because it is highly technical. Sustainable development is the key issue that all of us are facing today. My coun-

try, France is a developed nation, thus, we need to think about our consumption patterns and how we can modify these to evolve eco-friendly practices. Meanwhile, the developing countries need to come up with efficient techniques of using these environment friendly but costlier alternatives. Only if we work closely together can we move ahead.

How does YRoNS strengthen cultural and global bonds?

YRoNS 2012 hosted by Amity is a perfect example to show how the South Africans are collaborating with the French and the Indian teachers are interacting with the Danish. It's an initiative to help

shy students take charge and break the ice while respecting their individual cultures. Its an effort to facilitate cross cultural communication and enhance respect for other's beliefs while maintaining pride in your own value system.

Your take on collaboration with Amity?

Initially, YRoNS was an European entity; collaboration with Amity has given it an new dimension. It has helped to broaden our horizon and extend our vision to other parts of the globe. GIT

It is an international educational program that provides creative problem-solving opportunities to students from kindergarten to college. The competition




