The aim of the workshop, designed for Class V-XII, was to identify and nurture mathematical talent through conceptual clarity, improvise problem-solving skills, and promote passion for mathematics, enhancing chances of the students to win scholarships and gain international level experience. The camp envisioned and inaugurated by Dr (Mrs) Amita Chauhan, Chairperson, Amity Group of Schools and RBEF, witnessed the participation of 320 students from various schools across India, including Amity International Schools and Amity Global Schools. In her inaugural address,
