Amitians from AIS Gurugram 46 and AIS Vasundhara 1 brought laurels to their schools by winning several accolades at the Unified International Olympiads 2025, held at the national level from Nov - Jan 2024 with results being announced in July 2025. From AIS Gurugram 46, Adwaita Basu (VIII) secured national rank 1 in the Unified International English Olympiad (UIEO), while Sanskar Gupta (IX) bagged All India Rank (AIR) 2 in the Unified International Math Olympiad (UIMO), both organised by the Unified Council. Adwaita's outstanding command of the English language and Sanskar's sharp mathematical acumen made them stand out among participants across the country. To honour their excellent performance and

exceptional abilities, both were awarded a medal, certificate, and a tablet PC by the Unified Council. Adding to the glory, Amitians from AIS Vasundhara 1 also showcased their linguistic flair and mathematical talent at the olympiads. In Unified International English Olympiad (UIEO), Nivid Tiwari (II) secured AIR 18, Advik Chauhan (VI) AIR 77, Aarna Narang (VII) AIR 84, Shreeyansh Kar (VIII) AIR 93, and Samarth Tyagi (IX) AIR 64. In Unified International Math Olympiad (UIMO), Shreyansh Aggarwal (VII) achieved AIR 60. All the rank holders were felicitated with a medal, certificate of appreciation, resource book, and Olympiad online coaching subscription worth 1,998 INR.
