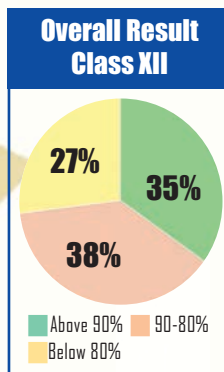
### Act 2 begins

One of my biggest challenges was completing the paper on time while still leaving enough time for revision. I overcame this by practising concise answer-writing and improving my time management through regular practice.

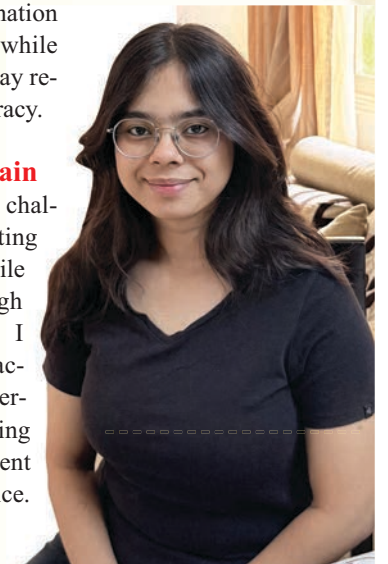
### Act 2 begins

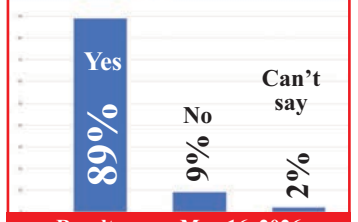
